
The practice of power




Christian Aid - Wave of Hope from the G7 in June to the COP26 Conference in November.

Leadership team have agreed the next steps in the process of getting the church back to something nearer normal.

- **All the chairs are back in church** so that the church looks like it used to.
- **You won't need to book your place!** There are more seats and groups of up to six people or two households can sit together. Although we will still have to space out a bit by using every other row.
- We'll still have to complete track and trace details and you'll still need a face covering unless you're exempt. There is still no singing allowed but we hope that it won't be too long before this changes.
- **We'll be serving tea coffee and biscuits outside on the lawn and patio after the service.** This will give people the much-needed opportunity to catch up and socialise.

As we make these steps to getting church back to something more like we were used to we'd love to see you back in church. We're a church family and need to spend time together- something that we've all missed - so please come back if you feel able.

New equipment for streaming and projection in church: request for financial support

At last week's church council meeting, members agreed the purchase of some new equipment to improve our facilities for video recording and/or live-streaming our services and other events and for projecting words, video and information to the screen. Church council want to continue to support our congregation by continuing to offer online worship to those who may be unable to attend even when we see a return to more 'normal' in-person worship in church. The council also noted that our online worship has been successful in bringing the Message to new people and the wider community. As future services will take place both in-person and online the purchase of this equipment is vital to support this mission.

We are purchasing a specialised wall mounted camera as well as a controller to operate this remotely. This combined with existing equipment will give us a better coverage of the church, more camera angles and remove the current tripods and cabling which looks intrusive, gets in the way, risks being knocked over and will not allow clear filming of the front of church as more people are sitting and standing during worship. We are also purchasing a much-improved projector and screen. This laser projector will give a much brighter and larger image with an aspect ratio which matches that of our live-stream. This means the same images or videos will be seen online and in church as we continue to worship in-person and online. The bigger and clearer images will be helpful for other activities such as film night and the improvements will allow the projector to be mounted on the back wall of church making its appearance less intrusive.

The cost of this equipment is likely to be close to £10,000 and, for this reason, church council agreed to ask members and friends if they would be willing to support this work by making a donation towards this cost, no matter how big or how small.

If you feel able to make such a donation you can do so in a number of ways.
